6.1 Petition - Improved Traffic Safety, Hoffmans Road

Cr Byrne tabled a petition signed by 7 residents requesting improved traffic safety on the western side of Hoffmans Road between Muriel and Crespin Streets, Niddrie.

7. Public Question Time

Question 1

Ms Rose Iser, of Travancore has asked the following question:

- a) Are councillors are aware of the problems with the planned Travancore bike path:
- that there are quite a few changes from Option C to the current plan, some of which are quite significant;
- that while the option approved by the Council indicated 4 trees would be removed, this now numbers 37;

- that residents support a dedicated bike path (which can be 2.5m), but council is building a shared path at 3m hence the loss of trees;
- that the plan on the website has no indication at all of new plantings and there is no detailed landscaping plan at this time despite contracts being signed;
- that residents supported a plan 3 years ago, changes have been made to the number of trees being removed, and no additional consultation has been undertaken with residents:
- that the plan seems to be under construction in isolation from the Moonee Ponds Creek rejuvenation plan;
- that a large number of healthy trees along the Moonee Ponds Creek are about to be removed with no articulated plan for any re-plantings?
- b) Will Councillors require the CEO to suspend the implementation of the plan while these matter are addressed?

Response:

The Chief Executive Officer responded that the Council resolution from 2013 was to:

a. Approve **shared path** alignment Option C as recommended by the Travancore Park Feasibility and Options Study.

The detailed design is consistent with the Council resolution to proceed with a 3.0m wide shared path and does not compromise the key objective of the project around separating commuter cyclists from other users of the park. The new shared path also provides an alternative / circuit access for pedestrians. The minimum width for dedicated bicycle path where volumes and speeds are not low is 3.0m.

The adopted Concept Plan indicated 25 trees to be removed or assessed for removal. During the detailed design every effort has been made to maintain existing vegetation, whilst still complying with relevant standards and guidelines to ensure the safety of park and path users. This included minor adjustments to path alignment, reduced clearance near the significant gum tree, raising path levels to reduce excavation and impact on root zones and boring of drainage near trees.

Reducing the clearance requirement at other locations may also enable the retention of some additional trees. Council designers will review the path clearance and consider reduced buffer zones of 0.5m at locations where this will result in the retention of any trees that are in good health, provide a reasonable landscape contribution and have a useful life expectancy. 1.0m buffer zones will be maintained in other locations where significant trees are not impacted. This review will completed by the end of this next week.

Council plans to replace trees that are to be removed with native stock and species which are appropriate for rider safety as well as for screening and habitat. Council is developing a detailed landscape proposal and will seek input from the community on the plan. The plan will seek to enhance Travancore Park

and provide a net gain in planting to offset any tree loss as a result of the path works.

The consultant preparing the Moonee Ponds Creek Linear Master Plan was provided with all relevant background documents including the proposed shared path.

Council designers will review the path clearance and consider reduced buffer zones of 0.5m at locations where this will result in the retention of any trees that are in good health, provide a reasonable landscape contribution and have a useful life expectancy.

My advice to Council is not to suspend implementation of the path as suspension may result in delay penalties on the Contract and would be subject to negotiation with the Contractor.

The Licence Agreement between MVCC and CPB Contractors Pty Ltd (contractor for CTW) includes a \$100,000 contribution to the Travancore Park Shared Path. Any suspension of works may impact on this contribution.

 The bulk, scale, form and layout of the proposal fails to meet the objectives and strategies contained within Clause 21.06 (Built Environment) of the Moonee Valley Planning Scheme, resulting in a development that does not appropriately respond to the opportunities and constraints of the site as well as the surrounding context.

- 2. The proposal fails to provide sufficient car parking as required under Clause 52.06 (Car Parking) of the Moonee Valley Planning Scheme and would exacerbate parking problems in the surrounding area.
- 3. The proposal fails to comply with the following provisions of Clause 55 of the Moonee Valley Planning Scheme:
 - a) Clause 55.02-1 (Neighbourhood Character);
 - b) Clause 55.03-1 (Street Setback);
- 4. The proposal represents an overdevelopment of the land.
